Primary Holdings:

Primary source material from local businesses and individuals.

Challenges:

• Housing current and new acquisitions.

• Defining and re-defining the collection strategy as donations are offered.

Primary Holdings:

18th century Spanish government and military documents as well as mayoral records since 2004.

Challenges:

- Processing 1500 Spanish colonial and military records without organization.
- Understanding antique vocabulary, spelling, and writing-style.
- Housing the records of each governor.
