APPLICATION FOR THE Ph.D. PROGRAM

ADMISSION TO THE GRADUATE SCHOOL OF THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS AT AUSTIN AND TO THE SCHOOL OF INFORMATION

Admission to The University of Texas at Austin is under the direction of the Registrar and Director of Admissions. Admission to the program for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in the School of Information (iSchool) is subject further to the recommendation of the iSchool Doctoral Studies Committee and to the approval of the Dean of Graduate Studies.

Incoming students are expected to have a solid educational background that prepares them for their doctoral study. The elements of that background may vary depending on the area of research to be pursued and its associated methodology. Applicants who are admitted without this background may be asked to take additional coursework as part of their doctoral studies in order to develop such a foundation.

For regular admission to doctoral study, you must have a grade-point-average (GPA) of 3.0 or higher (on a 4.0 scale) in all upper-division (junior- and senior- level) and graduate-level course work that you have attempted, and you should have a high score on the Verbal and Quantitative Aptitude portions of the Graduate Record Examinations General Test. An applicant who fails to meet regular admission requirements may be eligible for admission under special conditions.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

In applying for admission to the School of Information, you must actually file two different application forms: one to the iSchool itself, and one to the UT-Austin Admissions Office for admission to the Graduate School of the University. The School of Information is an academic program within the Graduate School.

To apply for admission to the School of Information program leading to the degree of Ph.D. in Information Studies, you must take the necessary steps to ensure that

will receive, by the appropriate deadline, the following items:

1. Your completed formal electronic <u>Application for Admission to Graduate</u> <u>Study</u> at The University of Texas at Austin. If you are not a citizen of the

United States, you must send a non-refundable fee of \$75.00 (payable to the University of Texas at Austin) with your <u>Application for Undergraduate & Graduate Admission – Students from Other Countries</u> to cover the cost of processing your application. Additional information will be required by the University's International Office.

- 2. Two official copies (e.g., copies bearing an official seal form the registrar) of transcripts of the undergraduate and graduate work you have done at every senior college you have attended. You must request those transcripts form the registrar of <u>each</u> institution.
- 3. A copy of the report on your Graduate Record Examinations General Test (the GRE) from the Educational Testing Service (ETS), sent directly to the Office of Admissions. If you are an international student whose native language is not English, you also must submit to the Office of Admissions a report of your score on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (the TOEFL) form ETS. PLEASE NOTE THAT IF YOUR SCORE ON EITHER THE GRE OR TOEFL IS NO LONGER AVAILABLE FROM ETS, YOU WILL BE REQUIRED TO TAKE THE APPROPRIATE TEST AGAIN.

After all the above credentials have been collected by the Office of Admissions, your application papers will be forwarded to the Graduate School of The University and then to the iSchool for consideration.
